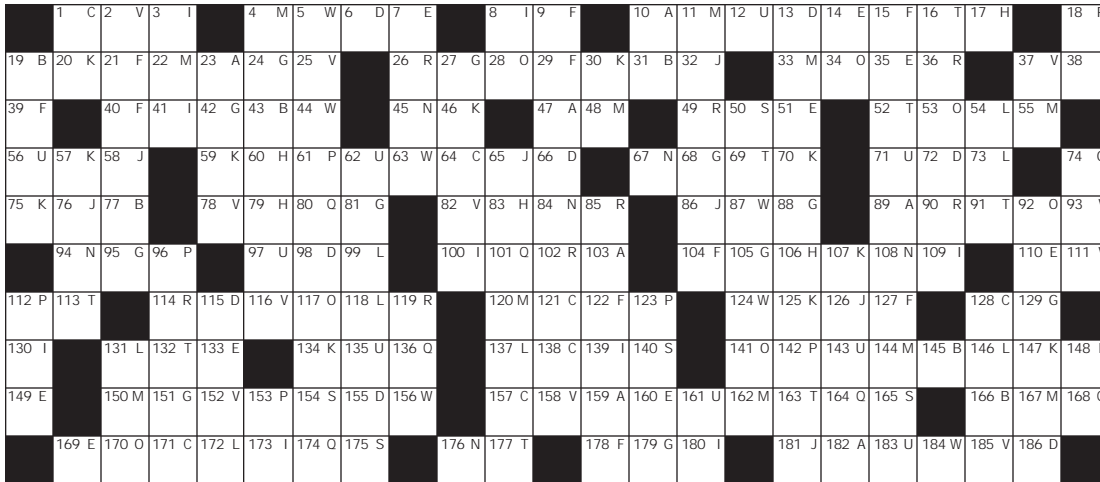


Double Acrostic
